



Tuesday, May 19, 2026

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Chair Jain called the meeting of the Authority's Board of Commissioners (the Board) into session in the Executive Boardroom of the Authority's Headquarters Building at 1 Turnpike Plaza in Woodbridge, New Jersey, at 9:07 a.m.

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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR COMMENTS

Executive Director Kolluri was pleased to report that we are 20 days or so away from FIFA and with the leadership of Deputy Executive Director – Operations Schaeffer, Director of Operations Dunn and Chief Engineer Hesslein that the work that needed to be done at 19W has been finished and thanked Director of Law Holl, Chief Information Officer Dios and Chief Financial Officer Luna for making sure we are getting all the necessary approvals for getting that U-turn ramp open so we can facilitate the proper

movement of traffic during FIFA. Executive Director Kolluri further thanked Major Dante Ruocco from the State Police and others for working with the New Jersey Turnpike Authority to ensure, during the eight games, that no unauthorized vehicles will be able to stand on our shoulders of the Western Spur waiting for pickup of fans who may have gone to the game and shared that NJ Transit, Host Committee and FIFA are all providing adequate services to transport people to these games and explained that we are not only strongly discouraging people but we will take immediate action with the help of the State Police should there be any unauthorized vehicles on the shoulders.

Executive Director Kolluri was pleased to report to the Board that he has been presented with a Land Plan draft report and is giving another 90 days to determine a final approach of the first few selected properties that we can take to marketplace. Executive Director Kolluri is pleased with the progress and after FIFA, will reconvene and will present to the Board and the Governor's Office.

Executive Director Kolluri addressed a traffic issue that Treasurer DuPont called in a couple of Sundays ago and wanted to give Treasurer DuPont and our customers comfort that between Chief Operating Officer Dilts, Deputy Executive Director – Operations Schaeffer, Chief Engineer Hesslein and Director of Operations Dunn that we are very focused on making sure that when there is construction, that our traffic is never impeded by making sure we do what we need to do with our contractors to make sure the work happens on time so the Turnpike and Garden State Parkway are free and open for our public.

Executive Director Kolluri spoke regarding the United Airlines incident on Runway 29 and shared that we are going to wait and see what the National Transportation Safety Board has to say regarding the results of the incident. Executive Director Kolluri stated he is very grateful for Director of Operations Dunn and his team for the work they did and their response to that incident.

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COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Treasurer DuPont acknowledged Executive Director Kolluri, Chief Operating Officer Dilts and Deputy Executive Director – Operations Schaeffer for their response regarding the call he made that occurred on a Sunday with an issue that needed to be addressed immediately and advised that this demonstrates again the commitment and dedication that this Management Team and Leadership have in serving the public and shared that he is humbly grateful to work along the side of this team.

Chair Jain echoed the comments of the amazing job that has been done getting ready for FIFA and making sure our customers do not experience those traffic issues and allow them to go on their journey. Chair Jain shared that she really appreciates the New Jersey Turnpike employees.

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LAW

Director of Law Thomas Holl requested approval of Agenda Item Nos. 2026-05-126 through 2026-05-128. Moved are the items as follows:

2026-05-126

In a memorandum dated May 11, 2026, **Authorization for the Chief Operating Officer to Renew the Excess Liability Insurance Program and the Excess Workers' Compensation Program for One (1) Additional Year, (1) Excess Liability Insurance - Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance Program (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027), (2) Excess Workers' Compensation Insurance (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027), RM-201433, Budget Code: 10-822-441010, Amount: not to exceed: \$6,345,740.00,** was approved.

The Authority maintains Excess Liability and Excess Workers' Compensation insurance programs, which will expire on June 15, 2026. The Authority's broker of record, Willis Towers Watson ("Willis") has been tasked with renewing these programs for one or more additional years, upon the same terms and conditions as the expiring policies.

(1) **Excess Liability Insurance - (Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance Program) (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027)**

The Authority maintains \$100 million of Excess Liability Insurance above its \$5 million self-insured retention ("SIR") for General Liability, Automobile Liability and Police Protective Liability claims (the "Program"). After reviewing all quotations for the primary layer, it was determined that, considering price and quality of coverage, Safety National provided the best quotation for the primary layer. With

Safety National as the primary insurer, Willis continues to market the remaining layers of the program, upon the same terms and conditions, for up to the full \$100 million limit. Markets that quote will be evaluated by Willis and BGIA, the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

After consulting with BGIA and Willis, the Authority has determined that it would not be in its best interest to increase the deductible, nor to alter the Program in a significant manner. With that consideration, Willis continues to negotiate with the various underwriters to achieve the best program, considering both price and quality of coverage.

The renewal is proposed at a cost not to exceed \$5,750,000 which represents a premium increase and includes all mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guarantee Association ("PLIGA") surcharges and other applicable taxes. Willis will continue to market the program up to the renewal date to achieve additional premium savings and enhanced coverage.

Accordingly, authorization is requested for the Chief Operating Officer to renew the Excess Liability Insurance coverage, upon substantially the same terms and conditions as expiring, including Terrorism Risk Insurance Act ("TRIA") coverage, at a total premium, including all applicable state taxes and surcharges including New Jersey PLIGA and New Jersey Excess & Surplus line taxes for a total amount as indicated above.

(2) Excess Workers' Compensation Insurance (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027)

The Authority maintains Excess Workers' Compensation insurance (Statutory) and Employers Liability insurance (\$2,000,000 each accident and each employee for disease) with an SIR of \$1,250,000, with Safety National Insurance Company ("Safety National") that will expire on June 15, 2026. Willis was tasked with soliciting renewal quotations for coverage as expiring. It is recommended that coverage be renewed with the incumbent, Safety National. Safety National did not increase the current rate of \$0.2710 per \$100.00 of payroll for the renewal; and with the increase in payroll, this will result in an annual premium of \$595,740. This premium reflects a 0% increase in rate, and an approximate 3% increase in payroll, and includes TRIA coverage. It is recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal coverage to be bound for one (1) year as set forth above in an amount not to exceed \$595,740, subject to audit at the end of the policy period.

Safety National has also provided the same terms and conditions, including price and rate, for a one additional renewal year from 6/25/27 to 6/15/28. Authorization is also requested for the Chief Operating Officer to renew the excess Workers Compensation program for a second additional year, upon the same terms and conditions, including premium rate.

It is therefore requested that the Commissioners authorize the Chief Operating Officer to renew the insurance policies and coverages as outlined above. It is further requested that the Commissioners authorize the Chief Operating Officer to take all such actions and to execute all such documents after review and with the recommendation of the Law Department to effectuate the authority set forth above.

In a memorandum dated May 11, 2026, Authorization to Renew the Authority's Property Insurance Program for Property located on the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Program") for one (1) year from June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027 upon the same terms and conditions, RM-201435, Budget Code: 010-822-121010, Amount: Not to exceed \$13,000,000, was approved.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets and business income (the "Program"). The Program currently provides an All Risk policy which covers all property on both roadways with a total insurable value ("TIV") of \$29,429,245,499 via a primary quota share \$600,000,000 layer. This is supplemented by an excess layer which provides an additional \$200,000,000 layer of coverage. The Program is subject to specified sub-limits for different categories and/or exposures and is subject to a \$2 million per occurrence deductible. Standalone terrorism coverage is provided through Lloyd's of London, which provides broader coverage than insuring Terrorism through the Federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA).

Marsh USA, Inc. ("Marsh"), the Authority's broker of record, was asked to seek quotations for a one (1) year renewal, based on a TIV of \$30,103,332,719 which represents an increase of approximately 2.3% from the prior year's values. As this coverage is complex and the current insurance environment very challenging, Marsh approached the incumbent carriers and sought out new markets, many of whom declined to quote for a variety of reasons that were specific to their individual risk appetite. Markets that quote will be evaluated by Marsh and BGIA, the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

After consulting with BGIA and Marsh, the Authority has determined that it would not be in its best interest to increase the deductible, nor to alter the primary Program in a significant manner. With that consideration, Marsh continues to negotiate with the various underwriters to achieve the best program, considering both price and quality of coverage.

With respect to the \$200 million limit of excess coverage, this renewal would be the second year in a three-year rate plan that Marsh negotiated, with the 2027 premium at \$453,250. Similarly, for the excess terrorism layer, Marsh secured a three-year rate guarantee at \$38,600 for this renewal year, and with respect to the standalone Terrorism layer, the renewal rate during for this renewal year will be \$173,684.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal of the Authority's Bridge and Non-Bridge property insurance program as set forth above, for a total premium not to exceed \$13,000,000 for all primary excess and terrorism layers of the program as indicated above. It is further recommended that the Chief Operating Officer be authorized to approve the final placement of the various underwriters, after review with the Law department and BGIA. It is further recommended that

the Chief Operating Officer, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, be authorized to execute all documents and to take any and all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program as indicated herein.

2026-05-128

In a memorandum dated May 5, 2026, Authorization to Accept Settlement from XL Specialty Insurance Company on the Performance Bond Issued on Behalf of Rapid Armored Corporation for Armored Car Services, was approved.

Rapid Armored Corporation ("Rapid") was contracted by the Authority to provide armored car, banking, and/or money counting services at ten (10) Garden State Parkway toll locations and twenty-eight (28) toll locations on the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Services"). On September 12, 2025, Rapid provided notice to its clients that it was permanently ceasing its pickup and delivery services at the end of the day, abruptly ceasing all services to the Authority. The Authority immediately began seeking emergency replacement services on a temporary basis and called on the performance bonds issued on behalf of Rapid. XL Specialty Insurance Company ("XL"), a subsidiary of AXA XL Insurance Reinsurance Company, issued the performance bond as surety for the armored car services contract with Rapid. Following a detailed analysis of damages and extensive settlement negotiations, XL has offered to settle the Authority's claim against XL's performance bond in the sum of Five Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$558,706.00), in exchange for a full release of further claims on the performance bond (the "Release").

Pursuant to the Release, XL and the Authority agree that XL will pay the Authority a settlement of \$558,706.00 within thirty (30) days of receiving the fully executed Release. In consideration for this payment, both XL and the Authority release each other and their related entities from all claims arising out of the contract, services, claim, or bond, except for obligations under the Release. XL further agrees to indemnify and defend the Authority against any claims made by Rapid relating to the same matters, with the right to control the defense and the obligation to notify the Authority if it disputes the indemnification. Both parties agree to cooperate in the handling of any claim raised by Rapid.

Settlement of this matter is advisable given that it delivers financial and operational certainty for the Authority in the resolution of this claim. Acceptance of this fixed amount ensures immediate recovery by the Authority for Rapid's abrupt cessation of services and, crucially, the funds can be deployed by the Authority to secure replacement services and to cover financial expenses resulting from Rapid's unanticipated breach. In addition, acceptance of this settlement offer preserves Authority resources and eliminates the financial costs inherent in a protracted legal dispute.

Based on the foregoing, the Law Department requests the Board of Commissioners approve this settlement pursuant to the terms set forth above and authorize the Chief Operating Officer to execute any and all documents and take all necessary steps to fulfill the intent and purpose of this settlement.

Chief Engineer Daniel Hesslein requested approval of item numbers 2026-05-129 through 2026-05-137. Moved is the item as follows:

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PUBLIC BID SOLICITATIONS – AWARD OF CONTRACTS

2026-05-129

In a document dated April 29, 2026, **Recommendation to Award Contract No. T200.618, New Jersey Turnpike, Daidone Electric, Inc., Roadway Lighting Improvements, New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 9, R-201338, Budget Code: 5000040019, Amount: \$21,394,000.00**, was approved.

This contract, managed by the Operations Department, will provide lighting improvements at New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 9, Mileposts 82.9 to 84.3 and the under-deck lighting at Hightstown Cranbury Station Road, Tices Lane, Franklin Street, and Monmouth Street at Mileposts 69.8, 81.6, 67.9, and 68, respectively. Work will include the removal of existing roadway lighting systems and installation of a multiple phase power and lighting distribution system with LED luminaires, including new wiring, conduit and foundations. All work is expected to be substantially completed by June 2029.

Three bid proposals were received on April 10, 2026, for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bidder was not prequalified in the required classification rating; therefore, the bid was rejected. The next low bid proposal of \$21,394,000.00 from Daidone Electric, Inc. was significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate of \$26,977,333.00. Operations Department representatives confirmed with the low bidder that they can perform the work at the bid prices. Daidone Electric, Inc. has previously performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T200.618 be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, Daidone Electric, Inc. of Newark, New Jersey in the amount of \$21,394,000.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest

responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant assigned to this contract, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

In a document dated May 12, 2026, **Recommendation to Award Contract No. P200.828, Garden State Parkway, Green Construction, Inc., Drainage Repairs, Milepost 120.6 to 123.6, R-201447, Budget Code: 5000010013, Amount: \$6,361,429.48,** was approved.

This contract will provide for drainage repairs along the Parkway from Milepost 120.6 to 123.6. All work is expected to be completed by August 2027.

Eight bid proposals were received on April 7, 2026, for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$6,361,429.48, may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$6,768,995.00. The low bidder, Green Construction, Inc., has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is therefore recommended that Contract No. P200.828 be awarded to the low bidder, Green Construction, Inc., of South River, New Jersey in the amount of \$6,361,429.48. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant assigned to this contract, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

In a document dated May 19, 2026, **Recommendation to Award Contract No. T200.901, New Jersey Turnpike, Richard E. Pierson Construction Co., Inc., Interchange 1 to 4 Capacity Enhancements Program, Toll Plaza 1 Operational Improvements, Milepost 2.0 to 2.9, R-201449, Budget Code: 5000056003, Amount: \$4,349,952.95,** was approved.

This contract will provide for two continuous travel lanes through the Express EZ-Pass lanes in both directions eliminating the need to merge, a closure of the excess barrier toll lanes in the southbound direction, expansion of the median U-turn and drainage improvements. All work is expected to be completed by November 2026.

Five bid proposals were received on March 26, 2026, for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$4,349,952.95, may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$4,521,183.75. The low bid was substantially lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$6,355,956.40 and likely due to the low

bidder's current involvement in the region and ability to self-produce asphalt mixes for the project. Engineering Department representatives confirmed with the low bidder that they can perform the work at the bid prices. The low bidder, Richard E. Pierson Construction Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is therefore recommended that Contract No. T200.901 be awarded to the low bidder, Richard E. Pierson Construction Co., Inc. of Pilesgrove, New Jersey in the amount of \$4,349,952.95. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant assigned to this contract, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

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ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (OPS)

2026-05-132

In a document dated April 30, 2026, **Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services No. P3320, Garden State Parkway, HDR Engineering, Inc., Supervision of Construction Services for Contract No. P200.828, Drainage Repairs, Milepost 120.6 to 123.6, R-201451, Budget Code: 5000010013, Amount: \$1,300,000.00**, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. P200.828, Drainage Repairs, Milepost 120.6 to 123.6. These services include construction management and inspection, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates, and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple" Procurement based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$6,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest ("EOI") was posted on the Authority's website and sixty (60) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B151, Construction Management and B153, Roadway Construction Inspection. Six firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of April 20, 2026.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) HDR Engineering, Inc.; 2) Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc.; and 3) KS Engineers, P.C. The fee submitted by HDR Engineering, Inc. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is therefore recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3320 be issued to the firm of HDR Engineering, Inc., of Newark, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,300,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.35 to cover the cost

of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The Webbs Mill Branch Mitigation Bank, owned and operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC, was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to be the only bank within the project's watershed that has

available riparian zone and wetland mitigation credits. Procurement will be a sole source, pursuant to the Authority's regulations.

It is, therefore, recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to execute Agreement No. 238-26 with Evergreen Environmental, LLC, to purchase riparian zone and wetland mitigation credits at a cost not to exceed \$7,500,000.00 pursuant to the terms outlined above. WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has determined that the purchasing of mitigation credits is found to be the most cost-effective method of mitigation and will allow for the Project to proceed on schedule; and




